

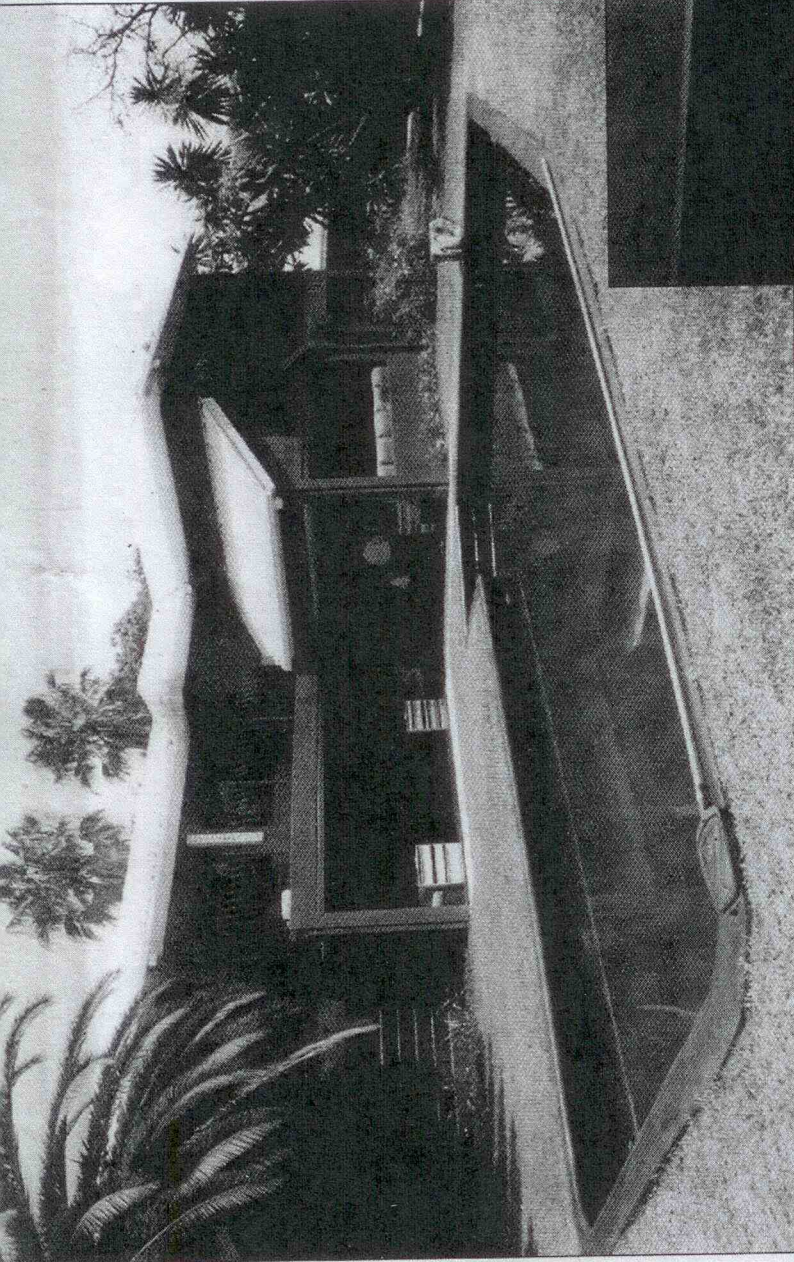

The company also swanks of employing 22 Malawians a thing he said will also enhance the social economic development of the country as the employees are able to support their families.

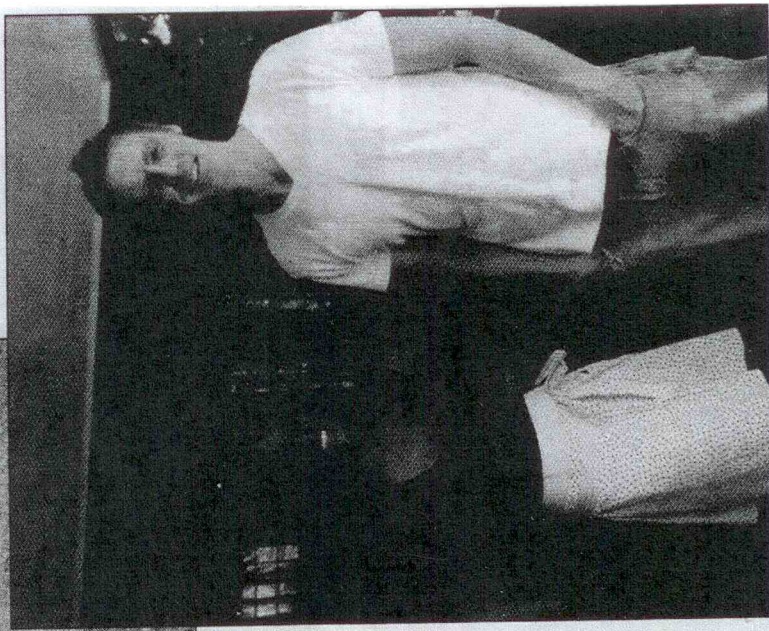
